

The United States Holocaust Memorial Museum (USHMM) and the American Library Association (ALA) Public Programs Office invite libraries to apply to host <u>Americans and the Holocaust</u>, a traveling exhibition that examines the motives, pressures and fears that shaped Americans' responses to Nazism, war and genocide in Europe during the 1930s and 1940s.

The special library exhibition — based on the <u>exhibition</u> at the USHMM in Washington, D.C. — will travel to 50 U.S. public and academic libraries from 2020 to 2022.

Developing Leaders Program

New York Library Association (NYLA) has announced the Developing Leaders Program (DLP). This nine-month

program (August – April), totaling 37.5 contact hours, will help participants explore and strengthen their leadership skills. The program will be delivered both in person and via online courses. The DLP focuses on 'soft-skills' that are applicable



across all types of libraries. Individuals with three or more years of experience working in libraries are invited to participate. An MLS is not a pre-requisite for this program. The program is limited to 28 participants.

In addition to the application form, a recommendation (ideally from the applicant's employer) must be submitted. To access the application, recommendation form and all pertinent information visit the NYLA website. Application and recommendation deadline is **Friday**, **July 19**.

Free Online Early Literacy Training from the New York Public Library

The New York Public Library is thrilled to announce the launch of its comprehensive early literacy training, *Raising the Bar: Integrating Early Childhood Development into Librarian Professional Development*, as a **free** online "train the trainer" curriculum. Over the last several years, the library has been working on an intensive early literacy training for its over 150+ children's staff that combines youth librarianship expertise with cutting-edge research on child development and best practices in early childhood education.

The training was co-created with the City University of New York's Early Childhood Professional Development Institute and funded by Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) as well as advised by a national group of experts, including Saroj Ghoting and Susan Neuman.

The new platform was designed with a "train the trainer" model, a philosophy that encourages learning by teaching and will allow facilitators to become experts in the material as they teach participants. *Raising the Bar* was developed as a bridge

to connect early childhood development to public librarianship, as libraries are often the first introduction to early learning for families. Expanding upon the fantastic work of Every Child Ready



of Every Child Ready to Read® 2nd Edition (ECRR2), the training focuses on family engagement and the belief that all librarians are community anchors, educators and early literacy ambassadors.

Greenwood Lake Public Library Presents "1969: 50 Years Later"



Lunch will be provided.


